Sermon: Worshipping God in Spirit and Truth

Sermon Recap

Jesus' conversation with the Samaritan woman reminds us that worship is not about location, preference, or routine. It's about responding rightly to who God truly is. God is Spirit, and He alone is worthy of our worship. But true worship needs to be grounded in truth, revealed through His Word, and ultimately through Jesus. We were made to worship, but sin distorts what (or who) we worship. Only through faith in Jesus can we be restored to worship God rightly—in spirit and in truth.



Scripture Reference

Read John 4:1-26 this week and ask God open your heart and mind to what it really means to worship Him in spirit and truth.



This Week's Keys to Remember

- We were created to worship God, not just appreciate Him.
- Worshipping anything other than God is idolatry.
- God alone is the one true, supreme Spirit. There is no equal.
- True worship is only possible through Jesus, who is the truth.



Pause & Reflect

Take time this week to ask yourself:


- What has been capturing my attention, affection, or devotion lately?
- Do I treat God as central to my life? Or is He just one of many priorities?
- What would it look like for me to worship God more sincerely “in spirit and truth” this week?



Scripture to Carry

It’s easy to reduce worship to music, emotions, or personal preference. But worship without truth is empty. Be careful not to shape God into who you want Him to be. The true God reveals Himself through His Word, and He alone defines what is acceptable worship.

“God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth.” John 4:24

 Write this somewhere you’ll see it daily. Let it shape how you think about God, and how you respond to Him throughout the week.



Around the Table

Consider these questions with family and friends, or even just think about them on your own:

- What does “worship” mean to you in your own words?
- What are some things people can accidentally treat like “gods”?
- Why do you think it’s important that worship is based on truth, not just feelings?
